


Seeking Liberty

Death's Head on loan from the Historic Annapolis Foundation's HistoryQuest!

Called the **Death's Head**, this piece of printer's type was excavated at the Jonas Green House in Annapolis. It was used to protest the Stamp Act in 1765.

The artifacts on display were discovered at five sites in historic downtown Annapolis: the Jonas Green House, the Brice House, the Governor Calvert House, the Maynard-Burgess House, and Reynolds Tavern.

Banneker-Douglass Museum is also sponsoring a self-guided cell phone tour of **Seeking Liberty**, including these five sites. This tour will be available as a podcast on the exhibit's website.
